Habitat for Humanity and Lowe's challenge women volunteers to build houses during National Women Build Week

Charleston, SC—In the days leading up to Mother's Day, construction crews of women will be pounding nails, raising walls and laying brick at Habitat construction sites across the country in recognition of National Women Build Week, May 2-9. In North Charleston, on May 2nd, Women Build Week begins at Charleston Habitat for Humanity! Women from the Charleston community will join together to help with Charleston Habitat's home rehab program by repairing the roof and the siding at 2524 Violet Avenue in North Charleston. Also, volunteers will make the bathroom handicap accessible at this home for the Gardner Family.

Women will build from 8:30am-3:00pm at 2524 Violent Avenue on the following dates:

May 2nd, May 6th, May 7th-May 9th.

Developed through the partnership between Lowe's and Habitat for Humanity, National Women Build Week challenges women to devote at least one day to the effort to eliminate poverty housing. The Mother's Day timeframe was selected for its significance to many volunteers, as families with children make up the staggering number of those in need of adequate housing: more than 12 million children- one in six-live in poverty housing in the United States. To date, women volunteers have built more than 1,400 Habitat houses nationwide.

Lowe's awarded Charleston Habitat for Humanity a \$5,000 grant to use for purchasing materials. Over 170 other Habitat affiliates were chosen to receive grants from Lowes during Women Build Week. Other funders for the Charleston Habitat for Humanity Women Build Week include The Exchange Club of Charleston and Habitat for Humanity International's Softwood Lumber Program.

Michelle Beach, Charleston Habitat volunteer and participant in the upcoming Women Build Week, states, "What I really love about this program is meeting the families and being a part of something bigger than myself. I've even started some projects at my own home, just from the skills I have learned while working with Habitat."
